Col. Matthew Mapes, an Illinois native, has over 24 years of service in the U.S. Army. He graduated from Northern Illinois University in 1999 as a Reserve Officers' Training Corps Distinguished Military Graduate with a bachelor's degree in Public Health and commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Army's Medical Service Corps.
