As the senior Noncommissioned Officer assigned to Evans Army Community Hospital (EACH), CSM Brockway is a key part of the EACH mission to optimize human performance and health readiness at Fort Carson.

A native of Groton, New York, he enlisted in the Army on 22 February, 1996, where he attended basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri and trained as a Radiology Specialist (68P) at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

CSM Brockway has held numerous duty positions from Squad Leader to Clinical NCOIC, and Department NCOIC to Senior Clinical NCO. He served as the 1SG at Bassett Army

Community Hospital, Fort Wainwright, Alaska, and later served as the Senior Practical Nurse NCOIC at Martin Army Community Hospital, Fort Benning, Georgia.

After graduating the United States Army Sergeants' Major Academy, Class 65, CSM Brockway was assigned to HQs 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Stewart ,Georgia. His follow-on assignments were Keller Army Community Hospital at West Point, New York, followed by the 5-306 Brigade Support Battalion, where he served as the Command Sergeant Major.
